## Out on the Ice League

Out on the Ice is Kitchener-Waterloo's first queer curling league, founded in September 2024. Out on The Ice (get the pun?) is a social curling league, open to all skill levels. The season started with a crash course "Learn to Curl" program and now consists of weekly games following a jitney format.



We've expanded to talking with community partners, such as Spectrum, Waterloo Regions Queer not-for-profit. Spectrum facilitates several weekly queer athletic drop-in events. Featuring sports such as pickle ball, dance, yoga, volleyball and basketball. As conveners, we saw an opportunity to introduce more 2SLGBTQIA+ folks to the sport of curling by reaching out to partner with Spectrum's Athletic Program.

On January 11th 2025, Out on the Ice hosted a Learn to Curl drop-in with 32 new curlers. The day consisted of 2 hours of curling instruction provided by a combination of the league conveners, Out in the Ice community members, KW Granite Club members and Abby's father and Alex's father-in-law. 
