

The Detroit end of the KW Detroit Exchange will be happening this November 7<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup>, and 9<sup>th</sup>. Sign-up sheets will be posted on board in the lounge and men's change room.

This is the 109<sup>th</sup> year of this curling bonspiel between Detroit Curling Club and the KW Granite Club; established prior to the formal organization of our current club. The format of this bonspiel is that KW Granite travels down to Detroit in November and Detroit travels to KW in March.

The cost for this year has not been determined yet, but last year, the price for both ends was \$160, and for one end \$125. The cost for new curlers was only \$100, and \$80 respectively. The cost includes complimentary hospitality (food and drinks), curling, lunch, and dinner at both ends. This year's cost will be posted shortly.

This is a terrific event that has been held for 109 years and endured many hardships that our two countries have encountered. Many of your past and current members are a part of this exchange.
